Lee Suan Hiang is currently Executive Director, Arts and Culture Development Office at the Ministry of Information, Communications and the Arts (MICA), and Senior Advisor to the National Arts Council and the National Heritage Board. Prior to this, he was Chief Executive Officer of the National Arts Council and MICA Fellow (Creative Industries) (2003-2009), Chief Executive of the Singapore Standards, Productivity and Innovation Board (SPRING Singapore) (2002-Oct 2003), Chief Executive of the Productivity and Standards Board (PSB) (1996-2002), Chief Executive of the National Productivity Board (NPB) and Chief Executive of the Singapore Institute of Standards and Industrial Research (SISIR) (1995-1996).

He was also Deputy Managing Director of the Economic Development Board (EDB) (1993-1995), Chairman of PSB Corporation (2002 – 2006) and Interim President of LASALLE College of the Arts (4 Feb – 23 Sep 2008).

In addition, Mr Lee is Deputy Chairman of The Old Parliament House Ltd and holds directorships in Singapore Indoor Stadium, SLF Leisure Enterprises (S) Pte Ltd, Pasir Ris Resort Pte Ltd, The Esplanade Co Ltd, Singapore Symphonia Company Ltd, Singapore Chinese Orchestra Co Ltd, The Singapore Arts School Ltd, LASALLE College of the Arts, National Art Gallery, Singapore and the National Arts Council.

Mr Lee was awarded the National Day Public Administration (Gold) Medal in 1998 and the Public Administration (Silver) Medal in 1992, the World SME Association Award in 2001, the JETRO (Japan External Trade Organisation) Award in 2002 and the APO Honorary Fellowship Award from the Asian Productivity Organisation in May 2004.
